

# Plat Requirement Updates

**2008.04.24**

**Street Name Suffix – SRC 84.030**

Street address districts or addressing quadrants, as defined in SRC 84.030, shall not be included with or as part of the street names on any plat within city jurisdiction. Addressing districts are overlay adjuncts and independent of the plat. These districts are subject to administrative change and may violate the intent of ORS 92.050(9).

**2007.09.13**

**Plat Names - SRC 63.115**

All tentative plans or proposed plats that are submitted to the city shall have a unique name as defined in SRC 63.115 and said name will be approved by the county surveyor as defined in ORS 92.090(1). In practice, the official name certificate generated by the county surveyor should be attached to the tentative plan when submitted to the city.

**One-foot Reserve Blocks - SRC 63.225(e)**

Reserve blocks that have been systematically required by staff in the past, have been interpreted by the city attorney and the city surveyor as not necessary - in most cases. The ordinance still indicates that the city administrator (and engineering) may require the reserve block when deemed prudent and necessary. Reserve blocks on plats will be the exception rather than the rule.
