SUBJECT: **DEVELOPMENT BULLETIN #32**

The following information is distributed as a public service to the Salem development community of engineers, architects, contractors, builders, and developers to make them aware of any changes in the City permit and plan approval process, design standards, or construction standards which may have an impact on their operations:

**DESIGN STANDARDS FOR SPECIAL FACILITIES
WASTEWATER PUMP STATIONS
WATER PUMP STATIONS
WATER RESERVOIRS**

PURPOSE: IMPLEMENTATION OF NEW CITY OF SALEM DESIGN STANDARDS

In order to provide uniformity and consistency in wastewater pump stations, water pump stations and water reservoirs the City has developed a series of standards which will be used in the planning, design, and construction of these “special facilities”. We believe these new standards will meet our objective of clearly communicating the City requirements for these types of facilities, and in turn, will help to achieve the required facility features and design life. **These new design standards will be applied to all applicable projects submitted for approval effective September 30, 1999.**

The new design standards make reference to a City Standard entitled *SCADA and Electrical Standards*. This standard is currently under development and not available to the public in final form. Users of the *Design Standards for Special Facilities* are directed to contact the Public Works Department, Operations Division Facility Engineer (Facilities Engineering Section) at (503) 588-6063 to discuss current, interim SCADA and electrical requirements for “Special Facilities” prior to beginning project development and/or design. All holders of the City of Salem Design Standards will be notified by subsequent development bulletin once the *SCADA and Electrical Standards* become available.
