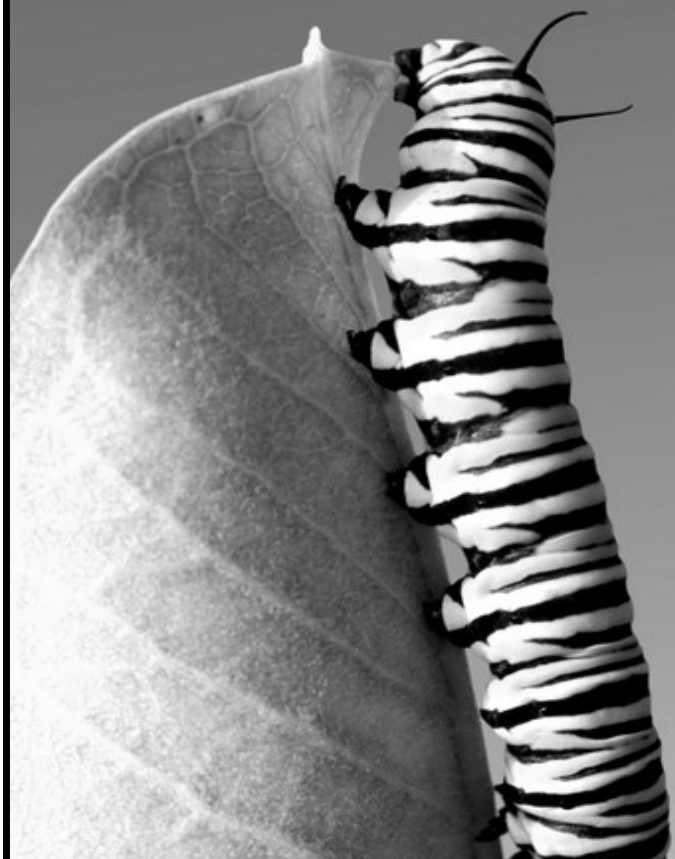
Sabotage: The Mission to Destroy Hitler's Atomic Bomb by Neal Bascomb

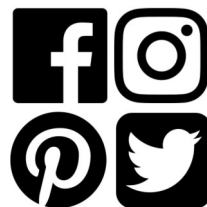
